- ✓ 25 Credits
- ✓ 2.0 GPA for Conventional Diploma
- ✓ 3.5 GPA “with Distinction” Diploma
- ✓ Financial Literacy class – Life Management, Personal Finance, Economics or AP Economics (marked w/ a # on transcript)
- ✓ Proficiency in state required testing
- ✓ Optional-Service Learning -Millennium Club (100 + year of graduation)

# 25 CREDITS IN MORE DETAIL

Language Arts	4	4
Math	3	4
Science	3	3 (2 units must be lab based)
Social Studies	3 (including Global Studies, US History and American Government)	3 (at least 1 unit of US or World History)
Foreign Language	0	1-3

# TRANSCRIPTS

1. Find the “Graduation Requirements-Credit Summary” box. Students can earn a maximum of 8 credits per school year.
2. Find the total at the bottom of the need column.
3. Divide that total by the number of years you have until you graduate to determine if you have enough time to fit in the **minimum** requirements.
